

Learning Communities: Lunch and Information Session

Learning communities offer students and faculty the opportunity to share a small, dynamic group learning experience. A community consists of two or more courses that explore a common theme, such as “Gender and Identity” or “What is Justice.” Learning Communities allow students and faculty to make connections across the disciplines and create a community of active, engaged learners.

Currently, learning communities focus on the First Year Experience, and they are generally limited to courses available to first year students.
